




CLASSROOM STRATEGIES FOR A VARIETY OF LEARNERS

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PHYSICAL STRUCTURE

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- The environment should be set up and organized so that the child understands where the different activities take place and where the materials are kept.
- Key concepts to keep in mind when setting clear physical structure include:
 1. Establish clear visual and/or physical boundaries.
 2. Minimize visual and auditory distractions.
 3. Each classroom should be set up to accommodate the student with the most needs.

PHYSICAL & VISUAL BOUNDARIES

○ Physical Boundaries

- Room dividers
- Book shelves
- Desk
- File Cabinets

○ Visual Boundaries

- Tape on floor
- Carpet squares
- Colored coordinated centers
- Stop signs
