BERRIAN

- K-3 School 200 Students 92% F/R
- 2010-2011- All available staff trained engaged in Signature Training
- Began Leader in Me process in 2012-2013 (Leadership days)
- All teachers and support staff have had Signature training with most Staff having attended a Symposium or a Leadership Day outside of Berrian School
- On the "path" to Lighthouse status
- Infuse LIM by:
 - Giving each Kindergarten Student 7 Habits of Happy Kids
 - Lead Time in each classroom for 30 minutes each week
 - Blast-Off LIM presentations
 - Leadership Jobs in the classroom and in the school
 - Parent Education provided monthly around LIM
 - Using LIM language throughout the curriculum



ELLINGTON

- Our student population is 305 with 14 general education classrooms and 1 special education classroom for emotional disorders. Our free and reduced population is 43%, truancy rate 5%, mobility rate 13%. We have a special education percentage of 7%.
- Our 7 Habits journey began in 2007. 3 years ago when we began to work towards Lighthouse Status. We have had 1 Leadership Day with another planned for this spring. We have completed 79% of our evidence binder with a goal of completing this school year, 2015-2016.
- Also we have incorporated PBIS into our school in 2009. We have earned gold status for the past 2 years with a goal of achieving platinum this year. We have been able to blend the 2 initiatives well into our curriculum and environment at our school.







WASHINGTON

- K-3 School 250 Students 97% F/R
- 2005-2006 Started implementing 7 Covey Habits at Washington School.
- Began Leader in Me process in 2009-2010 (Leadership days)
- All teachers and support staff have had 7 habits training
- On the "path" to Lighthouse status

Our Journey:

 Created a family environment, heart-felt commitment and cheerful cooperation for faculty and students

QJHS

- Currently a 7th-9th grade high school and preparing for the transition to a 6th-8th grade junior high school (2016-2017)
- Dr. George Meyer started the LIM process with a Vision Day in the spring of 2012.
- Approximately 75% of QJHS staff (including custodial, secretarial, and cafeteria) has received the Signature training. Since the initial Signature Training series in 2012, all new hires of QJHS are encouraged to attend the 2 day Signature training offered every summer in our community.
- 24 staff members have attended Leadership Days
- 19 staff members have attended Symposiums.
- 2 students (along with some QJHS staff) attended a Leadership Day at Hannibal Middle School
- 56% low income population



Data walls everywhere-evolving and kid interactive





- Add the Habit # that students did not use to the referral and to what habit they did use to positive referrals. Add the Handbook page number for reference. Add Parent and student reflection
- Increase school identity Ex: In place of the gym, say the Bears Den
- Embed LIM throughout the curriculum- leadership notebooks, big rocks/little rocks, language
- Habit shout out with student response "Be Proactive" "I'm in charge"

EMPOWERING STUDENT LEADERS

Students take on various responsibilities that teachers or other adults would have.

- morning/afternoon announcements
- calling students to buses
- leading morning meeting not just participating in it
- 7 Habits journalists--help create newsletter
- School tour guides
- Bathroom monitors

Students create personal mission statements.

Student leaders helping various staff members such as cooks, custodians--older students helping younger students with things such as milk cartons etc.

One school visited let students choose to donate class rewards to a local hosipital or keep them for themselves (legos). Every student has chosen to donate!


Each grade level leads a service project.


Some student leaders dressed the part.
