# What is Social Emotional Learning?

Social and emotional learning is the process through which children and adults acquire the knowledge, attitudes, and skills to:

- Recognize and manage their emotions
- Set and achieve positive goals
- Demonstrate caring and concern for others
- Establish and maintain positive relationships
- Make responsible decisions
- Handle interpersonal situations effectively

### Benefits of Social-Emotional Learning

A new study reveals that students who participate in school-based programs focused on social and emotional learning (SEL) profit in multiple ways. Compared to students who do not experience SEL programming, they improve significantly with respect to:

- Social and emotional skills
- 2. Attitudes about themselves, others, and school
- Social and classroom behavior
- Conduct problems such as classroom misbehavior and aggression
- 5. Emotional distress such as stress and depression
- 6. Achievement test scores and school grades, including an 11-percentile-point gain in academic achievement

### Implementation Guidelines

- Classroom based curriculum
- Can be implemented by ANY school staff
- Outline with script to follow for each lesson is provided
- Lesson duration: 25 minutes (once/week)
- Academic integration activities (optional)

#### Working together: SEL and PBIS

- Cyclical schedule
- Are promoting positive behaviors at school, at home, and in the community.
- Are skill based with heavy focus on modeling, teaching expectations, and providing practice opportunities.
